Memorandum of alterations reported since ship was surveyed for assignment of Load Lines in

Defence Accommodation:

Fitted accommodation for 10 persons in the bridge deck space.

Toilets and wash basins installed, overboard discharge fitted with storm valves and above the freeboard deck, Scuttle from bridge deck, coamings and installation of ventilators satisfactory. The work was examined after completion and found satisfactory.

A twenty nine inch dia steel tubular escape shaft with ladder erected immediately forward of Aft Peak Bulkhead, at off-centre position Starb. side and extending from crown of shaft tunnel recess and upper deck. All connections made by electric welding and a watertight cover operated from both sides fitted to the 14' deck coaming of escape.

Alterations to accommodation bulkheads & rearrangement of heating and lighting made as necessary.

Becks, Casings, Coamings, hatchways, vents etc. examined.
