Dear Sirs,

Reverting to your letter of the 6th October 1922
S. respecting the date of build assigned to your Steamer "STAKESBY",
I beg to acquaint you that the General Committee of this
Society have recently given their consideration to the
question of the record of the date of build in the Society's
Register Book, and that it has been decided to amend the
existing Rule on the subject as indicated on the enclosed
copy of Notice No. 1446, so that in future the deciding factor
in arriving at the date of build for record in the Register
Book will be the actual date of the completion of the special
survey of vessels built under the Society's inspection.

I have the pleasure to add that the case of the
Steamer "STAKESBY" has been reviewed with others in connexion
with the new Rule, and it has been decided to amend the date of
build in this case to September, 1922, the date given on
the First Entry report on the vessel as that of the last date of
survey of the vessel during construction.
