Dear Sir,

With reference to the interview which a representative of this Society had with your good selves recently respecting the ferro-concrete vessels "CHETACITE", "CHETECAL", "CHETECORE", and "CHETELL", I beg to acquaint you that the cases of these vessels received the consideration of the Committee at their Meeting to-day, and that in view of their being laid up the Committee are agreeable to the Annual Surveys being postponed for the present in the event of it not being convenient to you to complete the same at an early date, on the condition they usually require in the cases of vessels which are overdue for survey and are lying up indefinitely, viz:- that the surveys be carried out before the vessels are again sent to sea, and that you undertake to have this done if they remain your property, and, should they be offered for sale, to inform intending purchasers that the classes are allowed to remain subject to this being done.

I shall therefore be glad to learn that you are willing to agree to this condition and that you will advise this Office of the name and address of the purchasers as soon as a sale is effected.
