Dear Sirs,

I duly received your letter of the 18th instant forwarding a verification of marking form in respect of the service freeboards assigned to the dredger "CENTAURE" and note that the French signal letters have not yet been assigned.

I have to inform you that the ships "JAMES No. 64", "JAMES No. 65" and "ERNI" have also been purchased by Messrs. Entreprise Ossude of Paris, transferred to the French Flag and re-named "ANDROMEDE No. 1", "ANDROMEDE No. 2" and "CASSIOPEE", respectively.

French Freeboard Certificates for the voyage from Southampton to Toulon have been issued by the Society in these cases and I enclose further Certificates indicating the service freeboards for issue when the voyage freeboards have been painted out and the service freeboards cut in and verified.


I await the receipt in due course of your verification of marking forms and also the voyage Certificates.
