Dear Sirs,

I have to confirm the conversation over the telephone this afternoon regarding the case of the Dredger "FOREMOST III" and it is noted that the preparations for the voyage have been examined by the Board of Trade Surveyor who has also made an inclining experiment.

A French freeboard certificate and copy in the new name of the "CENTAURE", with port of registry Toulon are enclosed, for issue when the freeboards indicated thereon have been marked and verified and when you have satisfied yourselves regarding the preparations made for the voyage

It is further noted that the three other ships belonging to the James Dredging, Towage & Transport Co. which are being transferred to the French flag will not be leaving your port for two or three weeks and in this connexion I have to request that you will forward particulars of the new names and port of registry and sailing draughts of these ~~XXXXXX~~ ships in due course in order that the appropriate French Certificates may be prepared.
