I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your classing letter of the 12th instant, relative to the steamer "BEBEK", and in reply have to state that this vessel duly returned to this port and again sailed for Bourgas, Bulgaria, for the salvage of some cargo from the sunken French s.s. "Jacque Fraissinet", and that I have had no opportunity of verifying and furnishing you with the full particulars of the salvage gear.

As regards the machinery spare parts, I beg to state that when surveying the vessel last, I found most part of the spare parts, required by the rules, to be on board, and the remainder had to be supplied; but this I have to verify together with the salvage appliances, on vessel, s return to this port by the end of the present month.

The first and last dates of my surveys of the hull of the vessel are: April 15th-July 29th, 1929, and the number of my visits are 18, as in my Machinery Rpt. 9.
