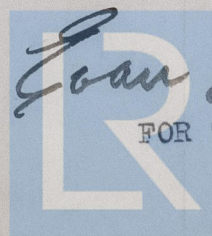
The Owners state that it is very unlikely that this vessel will ever be placed upon the northerly run to Skagway but will be retained in Puget Sound.
