Dear Sir,

With reference to the Glasgow first entry report No.38373 on the Boilers No.401 constructed by Messrs. Babcock & Wilcox Ltd., and now fitted into the s.s. "ADIGE" (ex "WAR EPIC") I have to inform you that an account has to-day been rendered to the Ministry of Shipping for the fees due for the survey during construction of the machinery of this vessel, and on payment your account will be credited with £36:10:4 for the survey of the boilers during construction.

I shall therefore be glad if you will kindly see that the necessary entries are now made in the Glasgow Rough Fee and Debit Books in the usual way.

I take this opportunity to say, with reference to the concluding paragraph of your letter of the 14th instant, that the Donkey Boilers Nos.8395/6 fitted on board this vessel, and Nos.8426/7 fitted on board the s.s. "FIUME" (ex "WAR GENIUS") will be accepted by the Committee, and you will be in order in informing Messrs. Cochran & Co., accordingly.

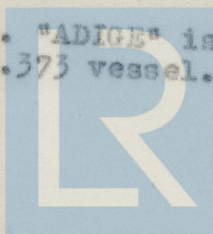
