Dear Sir,

S. I beg to acquaint you that the Committee of this Society have had before them at their Meeting to-day the case of the ferro-concrete vessel "CRETEGUARD", formerly owned by Messrs. Stelp & Leighton, Ltd., and now understood to have become your property. The vessel became due under the Society's Rules for Annual Survey so long ago as August 1921, and for Special Survey No.1 in May, 1923, and in view of the fact that these surveys are so much overdue and that Messrs. Stelp & Leighton state that it is not your desire to maintain the vessel's classification, the Committee have given instructions for the character to be expunged from the Society's Register Book with a red line, indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.

I have to add that in view of the withdrawal of this vessel's class the record of the freeboard assigned by the Committee, together with the corresponding draught, will also be withdrawn, and the freeboard certificate is thereby cancelled and should be returned to this Office.
