Dear Sir,

With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of the ferro-concrete barges "CRETEHIGHWAY" and "CRETEMANOR", I am directed to acquaint you that the Committee have had before them reports received from the Society's Surveyors at Newcastle from which it appears that these vessels have been examined in dry dock but that no arrangements have been made for their submission for the Special Survey No.1 for which they are both long overdue.

As you are no doubt aware, these vessels have been lying up and the classes allowed to remain subject to the necessary Special Surveys being carried out before they again proceeded to sea, and as they are about to proceed to Spain without the inspections being held, the Committee have had no alternative but to expunge the class of each vessel from the Register Book with a red line, indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.

I have to add that in view of the withdrawal of the classes of these vessels, the records of the freeboards assigned by the Committee, together with the corresponding draughts, will also be withdrawn, and the freeboard certificates are thereby cancelled and should be returned
