Dear Sirs,

With reference to your first entry report No. 17581 on the Ferro-Concrete Dumb Barge "CRETEHIGHWAY", I have to inform you that accounts have to-day been rendered to the Accountant General, Ministry of Shipping, for the fees due for the survey of this vessel during construction, and for the survey and assignment of freeboard, as under:-

For survey of Hull.....	£113: 5: 0
" " " Donkey Boiler..	9: 9: 0
" " " and assignment of freeboard....	2: 2: 0

Of the fee for the survey of the Hull, £22:13: 0 will be credited to your port, and the balance of £90:12: 0 to the Glasgow Office. In addition, the freeboard fee of £2: 2: 0, and one-third of the Donkey Boiler fee, viz:- £3: 3: 0 will also be credited to your Office, and you will be good enough to see that the necessary entries are now made in your Rough Fee and Debit Books in the usual way.

I may add that the balance of the Donkey Boiler fee, viz:- £6: 6: 0 will be due to this Office for the survey during construction of the Boiler at the Makers' Works.

The Classification Certificate has been forwarded to the Ministry of Shipping in this case.
