the Owner Mr. P. Dekker survey the motorvessel "DEMOCRAT" of 198 Tons Gross of Delfzijl, formerly classed with the Germanischer Lloyd en that the following parts of Hull and Machinery were examined on slipway and afloat

HULL: Bottom and rudder examined on slipway, hold fore- and afterpeak examined internally, engineroom, decks hatchways, windlass, steering gear examined and found all in good condition.

MACHINERY: Tailshaft drawn and examined, all main and auxiliary machinery examined as far as practicable and tested under working condition and found in order.

EQUIPMENT: General Equipment with anchors and cables examined and found in order.

FREEBOARD: The freeboards have been verified and found to be in accordance with the International Convention respecting Load Lines

and that we have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a report, stating that all repairs recommended by us have been completed to our satisfaction and that we have recommended that she be assigned a notation of "Examined LR 2,46" indicating that from parts now seen she appears to be in an efficient condition for a period of twelve month from February 1946.
