ALTERATION IN SHIPS NAMES.

Referring to our letter of the 8th inst., and interview with Mr. Watt this morning with regard to the change in the names of certain of our cargo vessels, the position of the ships is as follows:-

"DUNBRIDGE" - now "BREGON" is at Antwerp and will sail from that port on Wednesday next 28th instant.

"HOLDROCK" - now "BREDON" is due in London on the 28th instant. She will be in port about four days before proceeding to Antwerp, from which port she sails for Canada (via London) on the 7th March.

"MOTTISFONT" - now "BAWTRY" and "METHVEN" - now "BORDEN" should be in Avonmouth about the 24th February and first week in March respectively. The names will be altered at Avonmouth on arrival, and the vessels will be some weeks in port undergoing overhaul before going into service again.

"MONTEZUMA" - now "BERDWIN", and "MATTAWA" - now "BERWIN" are engaged in the Canada-West Indies trade. The names are being altered on next arrival at St. John. N.B.

The "MATTAWA" is due at that port about the middle of March and the "MONTEZUMA" a week thereafter. They are

about seven days in port.

We trust the above information will enable you to have the new freeboard certificates prepared before the vessels leave port.

In the case of the "DUNBRIDGE" we understand the freeboard certificate will be forthcoming when your representative at Antwerp has verified the markings, and we have so informed our agent and advised him to have the necessary arrangements made to facilitate the survey.
