Dear Sirs,

s.s. "SAN ISIDRO" ex s.s. "CARMEN".

I am favoured with your letter of the 4th instant, and have to thank you for your kind attention regarding the case of this vessel.

In reply I have to state that the class of this vessel was expunged in December, 1925, with a red line, in consequence of non-compliance with the Society's Rules, and in order to render the vessel eligible for the re-instatement of her class in the Society's Register Book, it will be necessary for the requirements of the 2nd Special Survey No. 3 to be held, including the drilling of the shell plating.

In view of the age of the vessel, and of the importance of the survey, it is considered that this should be held by one of the Society's Exclusive Surveyors, and I shall be glad if you will kindly inform the Owners' Agents accordingly. This will necessitate the sending of an Exclusive Surveyor to Las Palmas, or the sending of the ship to a port where there is an Exclusive Officer, either of which course will be a relatively costly matter to the owners, and I shall be glad to hear what they decide to do in the case.
