Dear Sirs,

With reference to the engines which have been built under the Special Survey of the Society's Surveyors at your Works for the motor vessel "ROCK", Messrs. R. & W. Hawthorn, Leslie & Co.'s Yard No.591, I beg to inform you that a request has to-day been received from the Shipbuilders for the classification certificates to be forwarded to them by return post.

The reports on the case have been under the consideration of the Committee to-day, when the vessel was classed and the engines have received a notation of RLMC 1,34.

In view of the Shipbuilders' request the Society's Surveyors at Southampton have been communicated with on the telephone and it is understood that they have ascertained from you that you have no objection to the machinery certificate being sent direct to Newcastle to be handed over to the Shipbuilders, and the hull and machinery certificates have accordingly been forwarded to the Society's Surveyors at Newcastle for this purpose.

I would explain, however, that it is not usual for the classification certificates to be issued until all the fees
