S. NAME Dear Sir,

I duly received your memorandum of the 19th instant respecting the "ULSTER CASTLE", the contents of which have now received the consideration of the Committee. It is noted that it is the Owners' intention to dispose of the ship at the end of this month and although the Committee are prepared to maintain the classification in the meantime, they consider that the outstanding requirements of the Boiler Survey should receive attention before the ship again proceeds to sea and that the prospective purchasers should be informed that the class has been maintained on this condition. In the circumstances I shall be glad if you will inform the Owners accordingly and obtain from them their assurance that this matter will not be overlooked.

I think it well to add that, apart from the renewal of the defective tubes in main and donkey boilers which requires attention to entitle the vessel to a record of B.S. 5,49, a further complete survey of the boilers becomes due at the end of the present month. In addition the validity of the modified Special Survey carried out in June, 1948 expires at the end of next month when the question of further Special Survey will arise.


