E) With reference to your letter of the 22nd June last respecting the Steamer "CLARA" n.n. "TERESA CAPANO", I have to acquaint you that the Copenhagen Surveyors reported on the 9th July that the vessel had been examined in drydock, bottom coated and the requirements of a General Examination complied with to enable her to proceed to an Italian port loaded where the Special Survey would be held on the hull.

The machinery requirements of the Special Survey were completed on that occasion and the screwshaft drawn for examination and records of LMC 7,53 and Shaft seen 7,54 have been assigned.

It is noted from the Shipping Papers here that the vessel arrived at Spezia on the 13th instant and in the circumstances your report is awaited in due course.


