Dear Sir,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated: August 16th, containing the Certificate of Classification for the French 3 Maasted Schooner "MARIE-JEANNE"; and of which I have instructed the Owners.

I must state that a steel wire of 60 fathoms; of 2.1/4" is on board; so that only a stream and kedge anchor will be supplied and also the three bower anchors to be tested.

I would feel much obliged to let me know per return of post, if the years of building: 1902; as suggested under the General Remarks in my Classification Report will be entered as asked for, in the Register.

This is in fact a capital point for the Owners; as regards the Insurances. In fact, if the vessel is entered in the Register with one year of building, viz.: 1902; the Insurance Premium for this vessel is based here on a 16 years old vessel, and then amounts till 10.5%.

If the vessel is entered in the Register Book, with a double year of building and rebuilding, as asked for in my report, the underwriters make here the following calculation:

16 years - 8 years 1 year for the old material remaining in the vessel;
would admit this ship by the local underwriters to be considered as a 9 years old vessel; and the Premium would then only amount till 8.5%.

You will admit, Gentleman, that this is a capital point for the Shipowners, and I therefore hope that you will instruct me immediately, of your decision on this point.

Will you kindly acknowledge me receipt of my quarterly account, forwarded 3th of July; and remained without reply up till now.
