Nature of Survey

The Newcastle Surveyors report this vessel placed in dry dock, bottom cleaned and coated.

It is understood the vessel has been sold to the Nigerian Government.

Alterations are being carried out to the midship deckhouses and the Owners Representatives stated no further survey would be required as it was not intended to continue the classification of the vessel.

The Surveyors forward a letter from the Owners Representatives stating they have received instructions from the Crown Agents for the Colonies to the effect that the vessel will not be continued in class.

It is submitted the class of the vessel be withdrawn from the Register Book and three dots (...) inserted in lieu indicating withdrawal of class at the Owners' request.

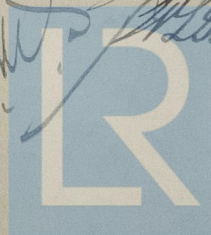
