## General Observations, Opinion as to Class, Recommendation, &amp;c. :-

State clearly whether any and, if so, what alteration is suggested to be made in the existing classification and notification of the vessel in the Register Book consequent upon this survey, thus, for example :- "to remain as classed in the Register Book without fresh record of Survey," "to remain as classed and to have record of survey, 1,38," or "to remain as classed and to have record of survey, 1,38, and the notations of ss No. 1-38."

This vessel as now seen, is eligible in my opinion to remain as classed, without fresh record of survey, and without special condition regarding the above casualty, but subject to all other conditions at present attached to vessel's class being dealt with as previously recommended.
