
Dear Sir,

I have to inform you that an application has been made by Messrs. Norddeutscher Lloyd through the Society's Surveyors at Bremen for the survey of freeboard under the provisions of the International Load Line Convention to their vessels "AUGSBURG", "GRANDON", "ESTE" and "ILMAR".

As this Society has not been authorized to assign Convention freeboards to German ships, I shall be glad if you will ascertain from the Authorities if it will be in order to the Society's Surveyors to proceed with the survey, and you should advise the Surveyors at Bremen accordingly.

I may say that the usual particulars extracted from previous reports have been sent to the Society's Surveyors at that port for their guidance if required.

At the same time I have to remind you that in the case of the "AUGSBURG", freeboard is a condition of the class of the ship in the Society's Register Book, and in the event of freeboards being assigned by the German Authorities, it will be necessary for particulars of the assignment
