Port tail shaft worn down 5/16" full.

Starboard tail shaft worn down 5/32.

Liners on port tail shaft in good condition.

Wood in both stern tube bushes worn.

Recommended

Port tail shaft to be drawn.

Both stern tube bushes to be rewooded.

Further recommended that all removals be replaced and where damaged in the course of the above repairs, repaired or renewed as necessary.

These recommendations made so as to place the vessel in the same good and efficient condition as before the damage was sustained.

The above repairs have now been completed to my satisfaction.
