Dear Sir,

A. I beg to hand you herewith the Classification Certificates in respect of the Ferro-Concrete Dumb Barges "CRETEHIVE" (P.D.93) and "CRETEMOOR" (P.D.112) built at Greenock by Messrs. The Scottish Concrete Ship Co., Ltd., and at Preston Dock by Messrs. Hughes & Stirling respectively, together with the certificate of test of the Donkey Boiler which has been fitted on board the former vessel, and accounts for the fees due for the survey during construction and for the survey and assignment of freeboard in each case, and shall be glad if you will kindly pass the same on for payment to the Finance Section of your Department in due course.

I may add that the fees in this case have been charged in accordance with the arrangement referred to in my letter of the 26th March, 1919, addressed to the Director of Contracts.

With regard to the freeboard certificates for these vessels I may say that those for the Barge "CRETEHIVE" were forwarded to the Society's Surveyors at Greenock on the 12th January last to be handed to the Builders, and those for the Barge "CRETEMOOR" were forwarded to the Society's Surveyors at Liverpool on the 11th January last.
