With reference to ^{my} ~~your~~ letter of yesterday's date respecting the case of the s.s. "BOMBARDIER", I am directed to inform you that the Committee, who have had the case under consideration to-day, regret that they have no alternative, having regard to the fact that they conclude that the overdue Second Special Survey No.3 will not be carried out before the vessel leaves the Tyne, but to give instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a red line, indicating that through non-compliance with the Society's Rules she is no longer entitled to retain her class in the Register Book.

Incompliance with the request contained in the second paragraph of your letter of the 30th ultimo I have had pleasure in forwarding to the Board of Trade a copy of the midship section of the vessel, to enable them to deal with the freeboard assignment.
