It will be noted from the Supplement to the Register Book that the class of this ship is qualified by the notation "Surveys overdue 10.57".

I would add that the following surveys are overdue:-

Special Survey of the hull due 10.57.
(partly held 10.58 see
Genoa Report No.23716).

Screwshaft Survey due 10.60.

Ship last examined in drydock 10.57.

The class is subject as given in the Special Reasons List No.179 under the previous name "BRITANNIA" (646 tons).

The vessel was laid up at Malta but, as a result of a survey held by the Surveyor at that port in October, 1960 following a request made by the London Agents of the Owners at that time, Interim Hull and Machinery Certificates were issued for the vessel to proceed from Malta to Naples in ballast with class temporarily suspended.
