SEBASTOPOL SEIZED WITH LIQUOR CARGO

Former Ship of "Coaker Navy"
Captured by U. S. Revenue
Service off New York With
5,000 Cases Aboard

New York, Aug 11. (C. P.)—Technically classified as a pirate ship on the ground it had changed its name without authority at sea, the trawler Sebastopol was seized off the narrows today with a cargo of 5000 cases of liquor valued at \$300,000. The name Westmoreland was painted over the original on the ships side, but the papers indicated that it was the Sebastopol. Lloyd's registry says that it was formerly owned by Newfoundland and at present is under St. John's registry but the present owner's name is not given.

By a message received in town yesterday it was learnt that the S. S. Sebastapool had been captured off New York Harbor by the United States revenue authorities, with \$300,000 worth of liquor representing 5000 cases aboard. She had a metal sign over the ship's name with "Westmoreland, Norfolk, Va." painted on it. This ship was formerly owned by the Government of Newfoundland but was sold some three months ago to St. Pierre interests for \$12,500 and transferred to French registry there.
