Surveyed the M.V. "INNESMOOR" 4477 tons gross of London on the 16th January, 1950 and subsequently whilst lying afloat on the River Tees for the purpose of examining the structure in the Deep Tank,

will and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and

will that I have Recommended that she be continued as now classed without fresh record of survey, subject to permanent repairs to cracked shell plate in 3rd strake, below sheer (S.S) at aft end of Deep Tank and 4th strake below sheer (P.S) at fore end of Deep Tank, to tank top plating (P.S) at foot of forward bulkhead brackets and to internal structure of Deep tank being dealt with on the vessel arrival at Bremerhaven and to renewal of wasted tank top plate in No. 1 Hold (P.S) next Special Survey.

being fit to carry to proceed, in ballast, to Bremerhaven in tow.
