I acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 13th instant concerning the assignment of class and issue of Load Line Certificates in the case of the above ship, which is to be engaged on service in the Solomon Islands.

The fact that the Society has no Surveyor stationed in that area, nor so far as we know is there a Lloyd's Agent Surveyor who could carry out a survey on our behalf, has been duly considered in relation to the second paragraph of your letter, and it has been agreed to waive the usual general examination which is normally required when such a ship arrives in her service area.

The Committee will, therefore, be prepared to assign a Class ~~+~~100A1 for service in the Solomon Islands, on receipt of a letter from the Owners stating that the ship has arrive undamaged within her trading area and has been accepted by them. Service Load Line Certificates will be issued on the same occasion.

Please advise the Builders and the Owners accordingly.
