RANGING AGAINST THE M.T."MAGEOLIA" ON THE 12TH JANUARY, 1960, AT PERAMA, GREECE.

It was stated that the "ALEXANDROS" was laid up at Perama, alongside the "MAGEOLIA", when on the 12th January, 1960 sudden gusty winds blew up causing both vessels to range and finally break moorings. Vessels were remoored on the 13th January, 1960.

No log books sighted as non available, vessel laid up. (The above information is the watchman's statement).

Upon examination by the undersigned the following damage was noted and repairs recommended without prejudice to the terms and conditions of the insurance.

In the opinion of the undersigned the above damage is reasonably consistent with the alleged cause.
