Surveyed the twin screw motorship "Orca" 500/ 363 tons of Rotterdam on the 5th October 1949 and subsequent dates whilst lying afloat at Nakskov harbour carrying out temporary repairs to damage stated due to mineexplosion in Fehmern Belt on the 1st. October 1949 and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be eligible to remain as classed in the Register Book BS without fresh record of survey subject to the ship being placed in drydock at Svendborg to which port the ship is to be towed from Nakskov, without cargo and without use of own machinery being fit to carry
