I beg to acquaint you that the Society's Office at Liverpool have forwarded to me your letter of the 14th instant addressed to them respecting the "T.S.S. "MARLOWE", from which it is noted that your Corporation no longer desire to retain this vessel's class in the Society's Register Book.

The case has been submitted to the Committee at their meeting to-day, and I am directed to inform you that, in the circumstances, they have given instructions for the vessel's class to be withdrawn from the Register Book and three dots (...) inserted in lieu thereof, indicating withdrawal of class at Owners' request.

I have to add that in view of the withdrawal of this vessel's class the record of the freeboard assigned by the Committee, together with the corresponding draught, will also be withdrawn, and the freeboard certificate is thereby cancelled and should be returned to this Office.
