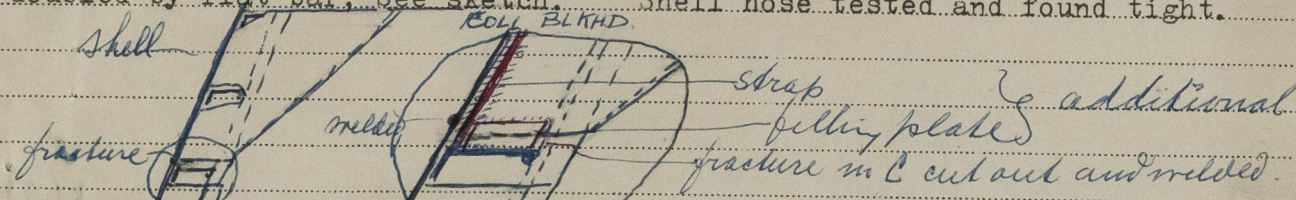

REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE FOR DAMAGE REPAIRS.

Leakage was reported in No.1 hold p.s. as stated due to contact with quay on the 19th September, 1957.

Found: Minor fracture in shell plate G-2, 2 frame spaces abaft collision bulkhead at toe of stringer bracket.

Repairs: Angle bar lug connecting bracket to shell removed, fracture cut out, e.w. and doubled by flat bar. See sketch. Shell hose tested and found tight.
