REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR *Survey for Classification and Damage states to have been caused by wear and chafing of hull and repairs to rusting and caulking found on bottom shell when vessel dry docked*

Work done in Dry Dock. Bottom Plating now in good condition cleared and coated, cables ranged and found in good order. The Hatch, Deck, Inner Deck, Portholes, E & B Space, Chain Locker, all double bottom tanks and peak tanks internally, Hatchways, Hatch covers & supports, Transversing cleats and battens, Mast stays, bridle, Steering Gear, Vents, Hand pumps, Boats and Equipment were examined and found in good order. All DB tanks & peak tanks were tested and found satisfactory. Ceiling was removed and steel work in way found in good condition. The hullwork as per Survey letter was marked, cut in and repaired.
