Motorship "WAZIRISTAN"

We are in receipt of your letter of the 14th instant, and attached correspondence, relative to the above, and I discussed the subject with Mr. Eliot Common this morning.

The comment in your letter was given to him, and after reading the letters of Mr. Rennie, he expressed his entire acceptance of them. The reply of the Agents in Houston was also shown to him.

He explained that the matter had been raised in view of instructions to Masters to have repairs done under survey, and that when the repairs were being discussed in our London Office, it was found that no report was available. He thought that reconciliation might lie in the Master having possibly made application to other alternative representatives of the firm, who might have been at fault, but this it was not possible to investigate at this time.

In view of this, and of his unreserved acceptance of Mr. Rennie's statements, I did not consider it necessary to pursue the matter any further, and trust this will be found satisfactory to the Society, and to Mr. Rennie.

Mr. Common mentioned that the "WAZIRISTAN" was at present at Falmouth, so that any examination desired and not previously effected could now be made.


