The Undersigned surveyor to this Corporation did, at the request of the Admiralty, attend the works of Messrs. John Thompson (Marine Boilers) Ltd., Glasgow, on June 29, 1943, and subsequently, to survey during construction and hydraulic tests one cylindrical multitubular boiler designated Works Contract No. 5209 and intended to be installed under the survey of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, in ship No. 11 being built by The Shipbuilding Corporation Ltd., (Wear Branch), Sunderland.

The material has been tested by the surveyors to the British Corporation; the boiler scantlings are in accordance with the approved plans for a working pressure of 220 lbs/in.<sup>2</sup>, and the workmanship is satisfactory.

The boiler mountings were satisfactorily tested by hydraulic pressure in accordance with the Rule requirements and were stamped with the test pressure, date and surveyor's initials.

The boiler complete with furnace fronts and mountings is in accordance with the approved specification.
