Motorship "GLORY"

The case of the above-named ship has received the consideration of the Committee today in connection with your cable of the 17th instant.

As a result they have authorised me to say that if the vessel is generally examined and special attention given to outstanding qualifications of class, including the cement boxes in No.4 hold, and all is found or placed in a satisfactory condition, the Committee will be prepared to maintain class until the end of February 1963 on the understanding that the vessel will not be trading outside the Indonesian service limits. The question of drydocking must be left to the discretion of the Surveyor holding the inspection, and if the survey is to be carried out at Sourabaya, you will doubtless inform the Surveyor as to what is required.

The Owners are being informed through the Singapore Surveyors that as the year of grace for this inspection expired last October, the Committee must require the outstanding survey definitely to be taken in hand by the end of February otherwise they will have no alternative but to deal with the class.


