Oil Fuel Bunkers. No.2 double bottom, overflow tank port. No.4 wing bunker starboard.

Tanks tested: Fresh Water Tanks, No.1 & 2 deep p & s, No.3 centre, No.5 wing port, No.5 wing starboard (in way of No. 4 deep only).
