the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Severney Yard, Leningrad, attend at their Boiler Shop on various occasions and surveyed during construction the riveted steel air receiver for the Motor vessel "SMOLNY". The materials have been tested by the Surveyors to Lloyds Register, the plan of same has been approved for a working pressure of 13.5 kg/cm<sup>2</sup>.

The air receiver was tested in my presence on the 19th March 1929 to a hydraulic pressure of 24 kg/cm<sup>2</sup> and was found tight and sound in every respect at that pressure.

Working pressure not to exceed thirteen and one half kg/cm<sup>2</sup>.

For identification purposes the receiver, which is intended for the storage of air required for burning boiler fuel oil etc., has been stamped as follows:-
