Herewith we enclose copy of Interim Certificate and Rpt. 3 in connection with damage sustained to the s.s. "FRANCIS FLADGATE".

This vessel has been built under survey by Messrs. The Burntisland S.B. Co. Ltd, and on the 14th instant proceeded to Grangemouth with a view to loading coal cargo, previous to carrying out steam trials over the measured mile.

Upon arrival at Grangemouth she fouled the steamer "CAMDEN", and sustained damage as reported. We may state that the steam trials are arranged for to-morrow the 18th instant, after which the vessel proceeds into service, and our Rpt. 1 on special survey while building, recommending that the vessel be classed + 100 A1, will be forwarded as soon as possible.
