

We have to acquaint you that we are forwarding by this post the First Entry Reports No. 31983, on the steamer "GENERTON" and have to acquaint you that the Builders request that the case may receive the attention of the Classing Committee at their meeting on Friday in order to enable them to be in possession of the Certificates on Saturday morning.

To complete the survey, the windlass and steering gear have to be tried under working conditions; completion of pumping arrangements, and the engines tried under steam, and the safety valves adjusted; it has been arranged for this to be done on Friday and a telegram will be dispatched immediately on completion and Reports 8 and 9 will follow.
