We thank you for your letter of August 10th in which you show your generosity by expressing your readiness to keep the subject ship classed as before.

We, however, are sorry to advise that following several reasons prevent us from determining our attitude whether we should accept your proposal.

As we advised you before, we have had the ship repaired in the Daesun Dockyard between July 20th and August 13th and passed by KR. As you know, the Daesun Dockyard is not recognized by you. So we have discussed with Mr. Shin over this matter and got the word from him that the ship should be docked again in order to be surveyed by him and to continue to keep the classification. Notwithstanding, our situation does not allow us to do this although we think his request is most reasonable.

In this regard, may we suggest that you extend the survey until June next year so that the ship may resume the classification. Please advise us whether the rules involved can permit our request and you will be prepared to do so.
