The nearest cables to the compasses are as follows:—

A cable carrying 14 Ampères 7 feet from standard compass on the feet from steering compass.

A cable carrying 14 Ampères on the feet from standard compass 7 feet from steering compass.

A cable carrying Ampères feet from standard compass feet from steering compass.

Have the compasses been adjusted with and without the electric installation at work at full power yes

Has the effect of switching on and off circuits, motors and other electro-magnetic apparatus within the vicinity of the compasses been noted yes

The maximum deviation due to electric currents was found to be nil degrees on every course in the case of the standard compass, and nil degrees on every course in the case of the steering compass.
