



With reference to our First Entry Machinery Report No. 6046 on the above mentioned ship, it should be noted that although the machinery was constructed under the inspection of the Surveyors to the British Corporation, the crank, thrust, intermediate and screwshaft forgings were tested in accordance with the Rules in the presence of this Society's Surveyors and the machinery was installed on board under our Special Survey.

It has been recommended that the machinery be classed with notation of L.M.C.\* , but it is submitted that the question of whether a notation of †L.M.C. could be assigned in the circumstances requires special consideration.
