Dear Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 30th ultimo regarding Glasgow First Entry Report No. 63686 on the machinery of the M.V. "EMPIRE GAT", I beg to acquaint you that the Surveyor states that the main engines may be circulated by the ballast and general service pumps and also from the auxiliary generator discharge for warming up.

Either of the auxiliary engines is sufficient for essential services at sea.

With reference to the second paragraph of your letter, I think it well to state that the Leith Surveyors inform me that Glasgow Report No. 61093 on the main engine (not auxiliary as stated by you) was not forwarded to them. It is concluded that this document is on file in the London Office, but in case it cannot be immediately traced, I enclose a copy.


