EXAMINATION AND REPAIRS AS PER RULE FOR DAMAGE, stated to have been caused by contact with barge (unknown) on 13th November, 1958 in River Thames.

WORK DONE & NOW DONE FOR DAMAGE: - Ship examined afloat and on hard.

Damage situated at stem badly buckled and set over to port from 3'0" to 14'6" marks Nos. 1 plates port and starbd. in 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th strakes below sheer badly buckled now cropped and part renewed.

Stem bar badly buckled cropped and part renewed and top portion part faired in place. 1 Shell frame port and starbd. buckled now cropped and part renewed and 1 cropped, faired and refitted.

3 Shell frames (2 port & 1 stbd.) buckled now faired in place.

2 beam knees buckled now renewed and 3 removed, faired and refitted.

1 beam end buckled faired in place.

1 breast plate badly buckled now renewed.

Forepeak tank tested and side shell hose tested on completion of repairs with satisfactory results.
