# LLOYD'S REGISTER OF SHIPPING

*This is to Certify that I have*

*Surveyed the S.S. "BELGRAVE" 1076 tons gross of Guernsey, while lying afloat at Guernsey and on Messrs. Husbands Slipway at Southampton on the 10th July and subsequent dates for Docking Survey and General Examination for postponement of Special Survey due September, 1958, for twelve months,*

*and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be*

*retained as classed with fresh record of dry docking 7.58, subject to two lengths anchor cable (removed for repair) being refitted at the earliest opportunity, indented shell plate D.5 from forward, port side, being repaired at the Special Survey before the 30th September, 1959, and to all outstanding items being dealt with as previously recommended,*

*being fit to carry her usual cargoes.*
