Extract from Official Log Book. Bound for Buenos Aires from Continent. At Recalada Pilot, River Plate, on 31/1/65 at 0100 hours.

Entry reads;- At 0145 vessel lost vacuum due to steaming through muddy water.

Extract from Official Log Book. Vessel lying alongside loading berth at Necochea, 1400 hours on 14/10/65.

Entry reads;- Vessel aground on mud at low water.

Extract from Official Log Book. Vessel at Puerto Galvan taking bunkers and fresh water, on 25/10/65 at 1300 hours.

Entry reads;- At low tide alongside oiling berth, vessel well on bottom in soft mud. Port side too.

Extract from Official Log Book. At Engineiro White at 0900 hours on 26/10/65. Approaching Loading berth.

Entry reads;- While manouvering past M.S. Marilen to reach berth, vessel touched muddy bottom and at each low tide this vessel as well as M.S. Marilen, slides off muddy shoulder to about 8 feet off Quay, this bank being on injection side of vessel.
