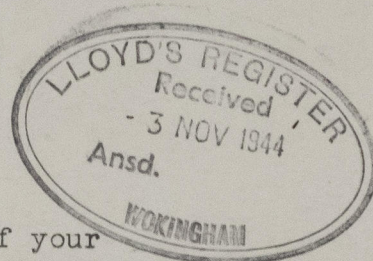

S.S. "FORT DUNVEGAN" and S.S. "FORT CONSTANTINE".

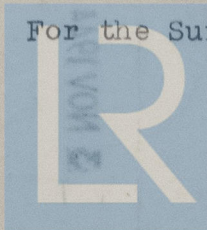
It is noted that the date recommended for LMC
