





We beg to acknowledge the receipt of your Classing Letter of the 6th ultimo, and have to confirm that the equipment number in the case of the S.S. "FORT KILMAR", Vancouver Report 6216, is 39853, and adequate ventilation has been provided in way of the upper fore peak store where a petrol storage tank has been fitted, as detailed in our letter of the 15th ultimo, in reply to your Classing Letter in the case of the Sister Ships, S.S. "FORT DUNVEGAN" and S.S. "FORT CONSTANTINE".


