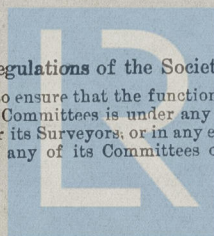

"HUMBERGATE", 1051 tons gross of Gooles, on 30th January, 1950 and subsequently, whilst on Clelands No. 1 Slipway on account of damage stated to have been caused on 27th January, 1950 whilst vessel on passage Plymouth to Blyth in light condition, and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have **Recommended** that she continued as classed in the Register Book with fresh record of Docking 2,50 subject to indented shell plating etc. (SSF) and set up bottom plating etc. (PS amidships) being permanently repaired by next Special Survey, being fit to carry her usual cargoes in safety.
